Possible LRUCC Civil Rights Trip

As part of our anti-racism ministry we are trying to gauge whether there is sufficient interest to develop a civil rights tour for Little River. Some of our members have gone on civil rights tours in the south, and spoken about how moving the experience has been for them. There are various places to see in a variety of cities including Memphis (MLK's final days, civil rights museum, etc.), Birmingham (16th Street Baptist Church, site of the bombing of young girls), Selma (Edmund Pettus Bridge), Montgomery (Dexter Avenue Church, Rosa Parks Museum), and many more. We are considering two options calendar-wise for the trip: shortly after Fairfax County Schools get out for the summer (mid-June) or in the fall, likely in early October when Fairfax County schools have a few days off.

The cost and itinerary are unknown right now, but we'd like to know if this is something you or your family might be interested in. No commitment is necessary at this point, and if finances may be a barrier to participation, please let Shelli know, as grants may be available. Participants not needing grant assistance would pay their own way. If you might be interested, please email antiracism@lrucc.org and let us know whether you prefer the June or October dates.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Food Pantry Donations on Communion Sundays and Wednesdays

Little River collects donations for neighbors in need across Northern Virginia and works with F.I.S.H. volunteers for distribution; walk in requests for food donations can be made by contacting the church office. We invite you to bring donations for the food pantry to the church on Communion Sundays (usually the first Sunday of each month) and place them in the narthex. Food donations may also be dropped off on Wednesdays by placing your items in bags outside the church front doors before 3 P.M. Food bags are distributed through F.I.S.H. and are packed with canned meat, canned fruit, canned vegetables, instant milk, peanut butter, cereal, pasta, and pasta sauce.

Children's Book Donations



As a youth of fifteen, John Milton composed a lengthy, elaborate paraphrase of Psalm 136 from which these lines have been selected. Milton, an English Puritan and Congregationalist, is best known for Paradise Lost.

Jesu, Jesu, Fill Us with Your Love


Tom Colvin, 1969; rev. 1994



This African folk melody was presented to the Church at Chereponi, Northern Ghana, by Ghanaian musicologist, A. A. Mensah, when United Church of Christ missionaries, Al and Sue Krass were serving there. Like Tom Colvin, a Scottish missionary in neighboring Tamale, Al Krass was encouraging the making of hymns to indigenous melodies. Tom Colvin wrote these words to this adapted form of the melody in dedication to the Church at Chereponi.
